2.	After presenting his second question to God at the end of chapter one, what is Habakkuk's state of mind (his response) according to verse 1?
3.	Why does he go to the watchpost on the tower and is it applicable in our walk with Christ today? Verse 1.
4.	What does God tell Habakkuk to do in verse two and what does he mean by, "so he may run who reads it"?
5.	What does God say about this vision in verse three and can we learn anything from it about God, Himself?

6.	Verse four is considered to be one of the most important verses in the Bible, why might this be so? See also Romans 1:16-17; Galatians 3:10-14; Ephesians 2:4-9 and Hebrews 10:35-39.
7.	Who in history is specifically is being referenced in verse four?
8.	Why would wine (alcohol) be a traitor, to whom is it a traitor, and what is the outcome? Verse 5
9.	Five woes are listed concerning Babylon, what is the first woe, what kind of person(s) does it describe, and what is there end? Verses 6-8.
10.	What is the second woe, what kind of person(s) does it describe, and what is the outcome? Verses 9-11.
11.	What is meant by verse 11? See Genesis 4:10; Luke 19:40.

12.	What is the third woe, what kind of person(s) does it describe, and what is the outcome? Verses 12-14.
13.	What does verse 13 mean?
14.	What is the fourth woe, what kind of person(s) does it describe, and what is the outcome? Verses 15-17.
15.	What is the fifth woe, what kind of person(s) does it describe, and what is the outcome? Verses 18-19.
16.	All these woes describe a person and a nation, and are prophetic. What person and nation do they describe and are these woes applicable even today?
17.	What does verse twenty say to you?
