2.	In verse three the writer makes mention of those under the first covenant making sacrifices for sin but still feeling guilty for those sins. What does this verse mean? Do people under the second covenant, the sacrifice and blood of Christ, not feel guilty for their past sins? Verses 1-10.
3.	What "Day" is approaching? Verse 25.
4.	Why do we need to "hold unswervingly to the hope we profess"? What is the implication of this verse and how do we apply it to our lives? Verse 23.
5.	What is the importance of verses 24 and 25 to your health as a Christian and to the health of the Church?

6.	What are ways in which you, personally, can "spur" your brothers and sisters in Christ "on toward love and good deeds"? Verse 24.
7.	Verse 25 says that it is the manner of some to forsake meeting together. Why today, do some, who say that they are Christian, forsake meeting together with other Christians?
8.	What is the warning found in verses 26-31?
9.	Reading verse 32, the writer reminds the people of the early days of their conversion to Christ and how they firmly stood their ground the face of persecutions. Why is it do you think, that after time had passed they need reminding? Does this happen to people today? Verses 32-29.
10	I.Who are the people "in prison" in verse 34.
